

Similarity matrix

Similarity matrix task is only available on bulk RNA-seq count matrix data node. It is used to compute the correlation of every sample/or feature vs every other sample/or feature. The result is a matrix with the same set of samples/or features on rows and columns, the value in the matrix is correlation coefficient --r.

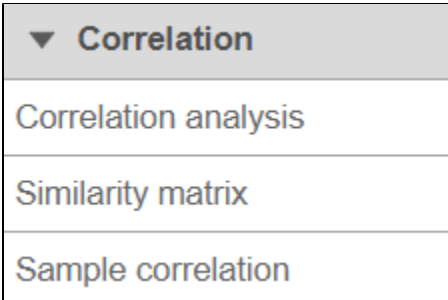


Figure 1. Similarity matrix menu

Click on **Similarity matrix** task in *Correlation* section on the menu (Figure 1)

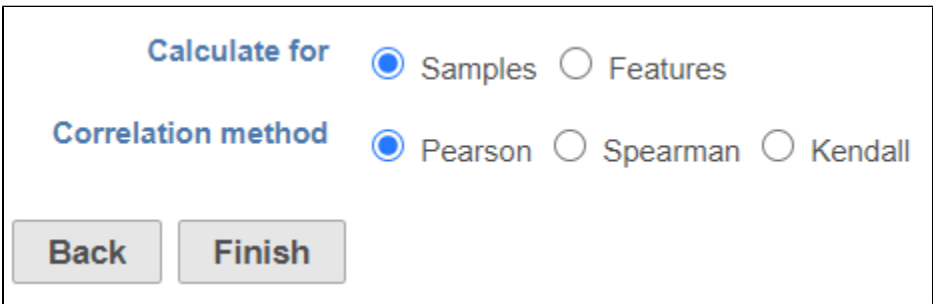


Figure 2. Similarity matrix dialog

When the dialog opens, you will be asked to select whether the calculation samples or features (Figure 2). There are three correlation method options:

$$r_{xy} = \frac{\sum_i (x_i - \bar{x})(y_i - \bar{y})}{\sqrt{\sum_i (x_i - \bar{x})^2} \sqrt{\sum_i (y_i - \bar{y})^2}}$$

Pearson: linear correlation:

$$r_s = \frac{\sum_i (R_i - \bar{R})(S_i - \bar{S})}{\sqrt{\sum_i (R_i - \bar{R})^2} \sqrt{\sum_i (S_i - \bar{S})^2}}$$

Spearman: rank correlation:

$$\tau = \frac{concordant - discordant}{\sqrt{concordant + discordant + extraY} \sqrt{concordant + discordant + extraX}}$$

Kendal: rank correlation:
